Six Funded Positions for Ph.D. Students in Global Supply Chain Research (EG 13, 75% of FTE)

The Kiel Institute for the World Economy (IfW) and the Department of Economics at Kiel University (CAU Kiel) are searching for six junior researchers specializing in global supply chain research beginning in October 2016.

Project #1:

Two of the junior researchers will work on the research project led by Holger Görg (IfW) and Horst Raff (CAU Kiel), aiming at developing new theoretical models of global supply chains (GSC) and carrying out empirical work motivated by the newly developed GSC models using firm-level data.

Project #2:

Two junior researchers will work on a research project led by Aoife Hanley (IfW) and Katrin Rehdanz (IfW), aiming at investigating the relationship between global value chains and green innovation as well as the effect of globalization on firms' energy use and emissions.

Project #3:

Finally, two junior researchers will work on a research project led by James Konow (CAU Kiel) and Till Requate (CAU Kiel) on laboratory and field experiments that examine moral responsibility in global supply chains.

The successful candidates are expected to pursue a PhD. in Kiel's Quantitative Economics program (see https://www.quantitative-economics.uni-kiel.de/en). The positions have a four year term and the salary is according to the German public sector pay scale at grade TV-L13 (75% of FTE).

Background and Resources

The three above mentioned research projects are carried out as part of a wider initiative by the Kiel Centre for Globalization (KCG). The KCG is a €2.2 million initiative by Kiel University and the Kiel Institute for the World Economy, funded by the Leibniz Association and the State Government of Schleswig-Holstein. The KCG focuses on evaluating global supply chains as an important aspect of globalization. It consists of four research teams that will analyze the relocation of production activities around the globe applying insights from the fields of Economics, Ethics and Management Science. It is envisaged that KCG senior and junior researchers located at the CAU Kiel and the IfW will interact with each other intensively.

- 4. Degree certificates, grade transcripts, and, if available, GRE or GMAT scores.
